

Transportation from the Airport

Toronto is served by two airports: Toronto Pearson International Airport and Billy Bishop Toronto City Airport. There are over 76 scheduled and charter airlines currently serving Toronto Pearson. To Toronto, nonstop flights are available from 26 Canadian destinations and 42 destinations in the United States. In addition, direct flights are also available from 56 other international cities. The downtown core is easily accessible from Pearson by taxi (approx. CAD \$55) or the Downtown Express shuttle to a number of downtown hotels (approx. CAD \$30).

Billy Bishop island airport is a convenient option for travelers from select cities in Canada and the north-eastern United States. It is located less than 4 km from the Metro Toronto Convention Centre and the Convention hotels. A short ferry ride links the terminal to the mainland. A taxi can be taken downtown for approximately CAD \$10. Also available is the free Porter Airlines shuttle bus that runs every fifteen minutes, between the mainland ferry terminal and the York Street (west) entrance of the Fairmont Royal York hotel, one of the official Congress hotels.

Canadian Border Entry

All visitors are to obtain the necessary documentation for entry into Canada. Inquiries should be directed to your nearest Canadian High Commission, Consulate or Embassy. All visitors will need a passport to enter Canada. For further information regarding Canadian Customs procedures, visit www.canada.gc.ca.

What to Wear

Visitors coming to Toronto in September should be prepared for a variety of temperatures. For men, a business suit may be sufficient during the day, although a raincoat may be needed. For women, a jacket or other cover may be needed, particularly at night. For excursion days, it is recommended to bring a light jacket and clothing that can be layered, as well as a raincoat.

Language

While there are two official languages in Canada, namely English and French, English is the language used in Toronto. In addition to these official languages, Chinese, Italian, Tamil, Portuguese and Spanish are spoken in certain areas of Toronto.

Canadian Currency CAD \$

Toronto offers visitors worldclass products without worldclass prices. For international visitors, our favourable rate of exchange means your money can go a long way.

What you need to know regarding spending money in Toronto:

- Toronto's currency is the Canadian Dollar;
- For denominations under five dollars, coins are used, including the 'Loonie' (one dollar coin) and 'Toonie' (two dollar coin);
- U.S. dollars are accepted in most Toronto establishments, although change from your transactions will be given in Canadian currency and exchange rates will differ with each merchant;
- You will find ATMs in most banks, hotels and shopping malls – cash is dispensed in Canadian currency;
- Major credit cards are accepted at most locations;
- Currency exchange is available at banks and kiosks throughout the city, as well as in the airport.

Time Zone

Toronto operates on Eastern Standard Time.

During your stay, Eastern Daylight Time (EDT) will be observed and is UTC minus 4 hours.

Tipping

If you are happy with the service you receive while visiting in Toronto, a 15% tip on the pretax bill is a standard expression of appreciation when dining out in the city. Note that some restaurants automatically add this gratuity when serving large groups, so be sure to check your bill.

Taxes

A Harmonized Sales Tax (HST) of 13% will be charged on most goods and services sold or provided in Canada.

Personal Property

Please take good care of your personal property. AIPPI, the organisers and the onsite staff are not responsible for any loss or damage to personal property.




